

Predator Tournament Rules

- 1. Dominion Outdoors is not liable for any injuries/accidents that may occur during time of tournament.
- 2. If a team wishes to cancel their entry into the tournament and receive a refund, Dominion Outdoors must be given notice up to 72 hours before the event.
- 3. At least one member per team must be present during tournament check in. That member/members are required to declare his team at that time.
- 4. A team can consist of up to 3 people, with each person possessing a valid Virginia hunting license. Each team must obey all laws and regulations.
- 5. Trapping, snaring, or roadkill is not allowed. Only predator species allowed are those in season in accordance with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.
- 6. Hunting privately held land must be done with written permission. Hunting is also allowed on any land deemed legal by state or local authorities.
- 7. There is no limit on number of predators killed.
- 8. A kill block with a kill code must be used with each kill and at the time of the kill. The block has to be placed in the mouth with a date & time written on the block at the time of kill. Blocks and numbers will be given out during tournament registration. A video must be taken during each kill with the predator and the block showing that it is a fresh kill. Points will not count towards any kill that does not have both a block and video evidence.
- 9. No frozen predators allowed.
- 10. Teams may not work with other teams to transfer predators and if done so will result in immediate disqualification.
- 11. Disposal of predators after animal check-in is the responsibility of each team. Please do so respectably.
- 12. No alcohol or drugs are permitted during the hunt or at tournament and animal check in. If any team member is perceived to be under the influence, Dominion Outdoors has the right to disqualify the participant.
- 13. Any fighting and/or arguing between teams or with Dominion Outdoors staff will result in disqualification as seen fit by Dominion.
- 14. No live decoys or tracking with dogs allowed.
- 15. Any downed predator brought to check in after 1:00 pm on animal check in day will not count.
- 16. Locating and calling predators is up to the team. No second team or 4^{th} individual allowed to scout for you.
- 17. The scoring system is based off the following point system:

Fox – 1 point, Coyote – 2 points, Bobcat – 3 points

- 18. If a tie is to occur, the team with the largest combined animal weight is declared the winner.
- 19. All team members must be present at animal check in to win.
- 20. At least one member per team must sign below acknowledging they have read and agree to the above rules and will make sure their team abides by said rules.
